More than 1600 streetlights in Mudgee and Gulgong will be upgraded this month as part of a major project to improve energy efficiency.

The switch to LED technology will see a 427 MWh per year reduction in power use, delivering savings of approximately \$141,000 each year in maintenance and electricity costs.

Street lighting is a significant expense for Council, costing around \$400,000 each year. The upgrade will go a long way to reducing costs and providing significant long-term savings. LEDs are more energy efficient, require less maintenance and have a significantly longer life. Council is committed to becoming more sustainable, and the LED upgrade is just one of Council's initiatives to achieve energy and


operational efficiencies over the next four years. LED upgrades in Rylstone and Kandos continue to be investigated.

The project is being delivered through \$808,069 in grant funding from the NSW Government's Resources for Regions Fund with more than \$200,000 co-contributed by Council. Learn more about the project at yoursay.midwestern.nsw.gov.au ■

FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK

It's exciting to see a number of major events will be hosted in the region over coming weeks and months including Council's Fermenta Festival in Kandos and Rylstone (13 March), Manly Warringah Sea Eagles v Gold Coast Titans (17 April) and Mudgee Classic (1 May). Large scale events have enormous economic benefits that filter beyond the initial event to our tourism industry.

Works have commenced to upgrade 1638 streetlights in Mudgee and Gulgong to energy efficient LED lighting as part of a \$1,000,000 project. The project will save hundreds of thousands of dollars in

electricity bills and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Council understands the importance of the heritage value particular lights have in our towns and villages and extra care will be taken to ensure these lights are retained.

Council has recently completed a major upgrade to Mudgee Airport's runway, taxiways and aircraft parking. These works will support a regular passenger service, critical air services and general aviation traffic for many years to come. ■

NEWS IN BRIEF

NEW MUDGEE DOG PARK
Following community consultation last year, Council will begin construction of the new Mudgee Dog Park this month. The park will be relocated from its existing location to the open space adjacent to the Glen Willow Suspension Bridge. The new park will be constructed in stages and will include designated small paws and large paws sections, 'Air-lock' style entrance/exit gates, seating and trees for shade, sensory areas for dogs and more.

Last month's fire at Mudgee Waste Facility remains under investigation and the cause is unknown. This is a timely reminder to residents to always be mindful of the items they place in their waste, recycling and green waste bins. FLIRTATION HILL WORKING GROUP ESTABLISHED

The Flirtation Hill Working Group has been established to assist in the development of the site's master plan. Council intends on improving Flirtation Hill, to enhance the site as a vibrant and active community recreation space. The newly formed working group is made up of Councillors, staff and community members. The site master plan will be placed on public exhibition once finalised.

bus. Pick up and drop off locations are available on Council's website and Facebook page. A low-floor bus will be available from the Mudgee CBD for patrons requiring assistance. Glen Willow Stadium is a short 1km walk from Mudgee CBD across Holyoake Footbridge.

NEW OPPORTUNITIES TO WORK WITH COUNCIL



ARE YOU PARKING CORRECTLY IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS?

Parking rules are designed to stop vehicles from parking where it would be dangerous or inconvenient for others. Parking rules are administered by the NSW Government and enforced by the NSW Police and Council's Law Enforcement Team. Instances of incorrect parking have been on the rise in residential areas in recent months and now is a great time for motorists to refresh themselves on the rules.

When parking, always do so in the same direction as the adjacent traffic. Parking against traffic (pictured) is an offence. Vehicles should be entirely within any marked lines. Also, vehicles should not be stopped (running idle or parked) on or across a driveway, footpath or nature strip, as this is also a parking offence. To learn more visit rms.nsw.gov.au/roads



WATER TANK VANDALISM

Following the 2019/20 Summer Bushfires, Council received grant funding to install 12 large water tanks at local RFS stations to aid in future firefighting efforts. Sticky nightshade (*Solanum sisymbriifolium*) has been found in many new locations within the region, including St Fillans and Riverlea Road. Sticky nightshade is a problematic plant due to its ability to invade pastures and compete with native plants. Council is encouraging landholders to be vigilant in keeping an eye out for this plant and to report any sightings. Landholders using imported fodder are encouraged to check unloading areas. Please contact Council's Weeds Team on 6378 2850 for any assistance you may require.

Council has secured \$2600 through the NSW Government's 2020-21 Local Sport Defibrillator Grant Program to purchase and install two new Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) at the Glen Willow Regional Sporting Complex. The AEDs will be located at the Complex's new Rugby Union and Junior Rugby League amenities buildings which are being constructed as part of Stage 2 works. The jointly funded AEDs are life saving devices that will increase safety at the premier sporting facility.
