OPEN FOR SUMMER Wudgee Pol

The region's three pools will open on Saturday, 25 September for the summer swimming season.*

Mudgee, Gulgong and Kandos pools are open seven days a week, excluding Christmas Day and Good Friday. Opening hours are available on Council's website. Season passes start from \$81 for children (2-16 years old), \$114 for adults, \$238 for a family of two adults and three children and \$81 for pensioners/seniors. Applications are available on Council's website.

Council has progressed with investigations to establish an indoor swimming pool in Mudgee, and following a Feasibility Study and community engagement in 2019 has resolved to use the existing pool site and sections of Lawson Park

due to the central location and new water park. A business case is currently being developed to investigate two options; the first to retain the existing outdoor pool and establish a 25 metre indoor pool, and the second to establish a 50 metre indoor pool and decommission the existing outdoor pools.

GALLERY AND INAUGURAL EXHIBITION NOW OPEN

The Mudgee Arts Precinct is now open to the public seven days a week from 9am to 5pm.*

More than 400 locals made their way through the new space over the opening weekend to see the inaugural exhibition Stories of Homedale by Mudgee-born artist and Archibald prize winner Guido Maestri. Due to its popularity, the exhibition has been extended and will be available to view until 28 November.

As well as gallery space, meeting rooms and staff offices, the Mudgee Arts Precinct is also the new home of Mudgee Region Tourism.

RURAL WATER FILLING STATIONS REGISTRATION

Rural residents are encouraged to apply online for their one-off registration to access Council's Rural Water Filling Stations. Registration is free and access to the fill stations is available 24/7.

Simply fill in the online form at midwestern.nsw.aov.au/ ruralwaterfill or complete the form provided in the July Rates Notice. Once registered, residents with email will have access via the Smart City Control App (https://app. smartcitycontrol.com.au/) and those without email will receive a swipe card.

Council has upgraded Rural Water Filling Stations in Mudgee, Gulgong and Rylstone to improve emergency water access for rural residents. These new filling stations will provide emergency potable water for rural residents, faster flow rates and as a result faster fill times. Customers will be able to access up to 1000L per emergency without charge.

KEEP GRASS CLIPPINGS IN THE BIN

The arrival of Spring and good rainfall means lawns will be growing quickly. If you're mowing, please remember not to let grass clippings blow into nearby gutters and drains. Grass clippings that make their way into storm water and eventually the Cudgegong River can damage the natural environment. Grass clippings can be disposed of in your weekly Food and Garden Organics Bin (the light green lid).

MAGPIE SWOOPING SEASON

Please be aware of magpies this Spring when walking or cycling in any of our local parks and open spaces. For most of the year magpies are not aggressive, but for roughly eight weeks (between August and October) during nesting they will often defend their territory vigorously. Magpies are very protective parents and may swoop anyone seen as an intruder who might harm their chicks.

As the summer disaster season approaches residents are being reminded that emergencies can impact at any time and our beloved animals count on us to keep them safe. RETURNING 2022

Council has made the difficult decision to cancel Flavours of Mudgee this year due to ongoing lockdowns and current Health Orders.

Council's Events Team investigated alternative formats and possible postponement. Unfortunately, the nature of the food and wine event as well as the uncertainty surrounding current restrictions

and ongoing lockdowns in Sydney and throughout regional NSW made this year's event a logistical impossibility. Whilst it's disappointing to cancel the event two years in a row, Council is committed to its return next year on Saturday, 24 September 2022.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS 4 DECEMBER

Local Government Elections have been postponed to Saturday, 4 December due to current health orders. Minister for Local Government, Shelley Hancock MP, announced the postponement in late July. All current councils across NSW, including Mid-Western Regional Council, will continue in their elected roles. Nine Councillors are elected by the community to make up Mid-Western Regional Council. These Councillors determine the direction of the organisation for the next term. WHO CAN USE RURAL WASTE TRANSFER STATIONS?

Rural Waste Transfer Stations are strictly available to rural residents who live outside collection areas. These sites are for the disposal of domestic waste and recycling, just as an in-town resident would use their kerbside bins, and should not be used for disposal of commercial waste.

If you are a rural resident eligible to use these facilities, please follow the signage and directions displayed.

Bulky waste (mattresses, lounges), green waste, commercial waste, hazardous and

liquid waste must not be left at these sites. Residential bulky waste and green waste is free to dispose of at Mudgee, Gulgong and Kandos Waste Facilities. Please contact Council for disposal of domestic quantities of hazardous waste, including asbestos (under 10m²) and household chemicals.

601 new businesses were registered in the Mid-Western Region in the 2020-21 financial year, an increase of 137 businesses compared to 2019-20. 395 (65.7%) of the new businesses were registered in Mudgee and surrounds (postcode 2850). Over 30% of the businesses were registered under the agriculture or construction industries.

Ferntree Gully is a stunning rainforest area 17 kilometres north of Rylstone. There are many walking tracks that take you down into the cool narrow ferntree-studded valley floor, around the top edge of the rocks with amazing views towards the valley and the unusual rock formations on either side. A loop walk takes you through unique plant communities and around a deep and narrow gully of eroded sandstone rock.
